Significant donations were made to the Community Foundation of New Jersey's NJ Pandemic Relief Fund (launched by First Lady Tammy Murphy) (\$100,000) and the Princeton Area Community Foundation's COVID-19 Relief & Recovery Fund (\$50,000).

Donations of \$10,000 each were made to the Community Foundation of South Jersey's COVID-19 Response Fund, Greater Trenton's "Businesses Helping Businesses" relief program, and New Jersey Community Capital's Garden State Relief Program. The donations will go directly to help supply food, necessities and essential services to needy families and individuals.

Other organizations NJM contributed to include: Philabundance, The Children's Home Society of New Jersey, Interfaith Medical Center (New York City), Kidsbridge, the Larc School, and One Simple Wish.

Additionally, NJM donated 200 square feet of warehouse space to Mercer Street Friends for storage as part of its food bank operations. The space is part of NJM's Silvia Street building location in West Trenton.
